Spring Admissions: **September 15** Fall Admissions: **February 1** 

Students must have completed at least one college-level course in mathematics and English with a grade of "C" or better or must demonstrate college-level readiness based on SAT, ACT or New York Regents test scores. Students who do not demonstrate college-level readiness are strongly advised to complete mathematics and English courses before their final semester.

**Note to students who have attended other colleges:** Your entire college/postsecondary school academic history, including grades earned from courses taken more than once, will be used to determine a grade point average (GPA). If more than one college/postsecondary school was attended, your GPA will be determined through a combined calculation of all attempted coursework. Please note that plus (+) and minus (-) additions to grades are not reflected in the GPA.

Associate in Science Degree from Bronx Community College.

Bronx Community College graduates with the Associate Degree in <u>Media and Digital Film Production</u> will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of <u>Art</u> in <u>Television and Radio</u> at <u>Brooklyn</u> College. In addition, they will be deemed to have met all requirements in the CUNY 30 credit common core.

## B.A. degree program in Television and Radio

Credits

The BA Program offers a broad exposure to fields of knowledge in broadcast and electronic communications directly related to critical/cultural media studies, management, and programming. The program's dual focus in practical and critical skills provides a springboard to careers in media organizations, teaching and activism.

Within the program, students are guided by scholars and media professionals and in return have many opportunities to conduct research, to meet with professionals throughout New York City, and to deepen their understanding of the vastly changing world of electronic media in preparation for challenging media careers.

BA students will immerse themselves in the media capital of the world. Many graduates attain positions within a range of media companies, or go on to further their media education.
