#### B. Admission Requirements for Senior College Program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

- Associate Degree graduates of Bronx Community College are exempt from all lower-division Lehman College General Education Degree Requirements.
- To earn the Bachelor's Degree at Lehman, Bronx Community College graduates need to complete the courses required for the major / minor, two upper-division interdisciplinary courses, one writing intensive course, and elective courses if needed.
- Bronx Community College Political Science students will be required to attain a minimum GPA of 2.0.
