About the Program

Digital technology pervades our culture, empowering individuals to transform the way we look at the world. The Computer Arts & Design program at Mercy College investigates the creative capacity of digital technology to improve communication, develop creative self-expression, and explore perception and interaction among people, objects, and ideas.

The Computer Arts & Design (CART) program offers a comprehensive four-year Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.) degree supported by the highest quality resources and facilities. After a sequence of intensive core foundation and required courses, students focus their studies by choosing from electives in Animation, Gaming, Graphic Design, and Interaction Design. Students are also encouraged to take courses from the cognate programs of Media Studies, Radio and TV, Music Industry, and Computer Information Systems. Writing, reading, and critical thinking assignments are a regular part of all courses.

Mercy College and the CART program are accredited with the Middle States Commission on Higher Education and the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD).

Admission

In order to be admitted into the Computer Arts & Design major, BCC students must:

- Complete BCC Mathematics Requirements
- Submit a personal essay not to exceed 1000 words and a portfolio of work to be reviewed and approved by the Portfolio Review Admission Committee

E. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

Bronx Community College Digital Design and Computer Graphics Curriculum Co-coordinator and the Mercy College School of Liberal Arts, will review implementation of the agreement once every four years to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success

Mercy College provides advisement to all students entering the major.

Mercy College will provide information regarding BCC students

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

Notice of articulation will be placed in the respective catalogues, recruiting brochures, and websites.

Respective transfer and academic advisers will be informed and provided with copies of this agreement.

Mercy College will coordinate efforts with their campus Admissions Office to make certain that materials are sent with recruitment officers for BCC's annual Transfer Day event.

F. Additional Information

Mercy College will accept 75 credits in transfer from a two year accredited institution and a total of 90 credits in transfer (including CLEP). Students who wish to transfer additional courses than those outlined in this agreement must get prior approval from their academic advisor.

Transfer students are eligible to apply for financial aid that is normally available to other junior class students. Scholarships awarded to transfer students are awarded on the basis of previous academic performance, demonstrated financial need and the student's potential contribution to the intellectual life of the College.

Trustees Scholarship - Transfers

Scholarships are awarded to outstanding entering transfer students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.7 or above, and an Associate's Degree. Scholarship awards are renewable for the duration of the undergraduate degree as long as the recipient meets the conditions for retaining the award. Application may be made during the interview with your Admissions Counselor.

Transfer President's Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to outstanding entering transfer students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.4 to 3.69 or above, and an Associate's Degree. Scholarship awards are renewable for the duration of the undergraduate degree as long as the recipient meets the conditions for retaining the award. Application may be made during the interview with your Admissions Counselor.

Transfer Provost Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to outstanding entering transfer students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 to 3.39 or above, and an Associate's Degree. Scholarship awards are renewable for the duration of the undergraduate degree as long as the recipient meets the conditions for retaining the award. Application may be made during the interview with your Admissions Counselor

NYSTAA Scholarship

Mercy College is a member of the New York State Articulation Association and eligible transfer students may apply for the NYSTAA scholarship.
