I have been invited along with two Bronx Community College/CUNY students, Grissel de Jesus and Willmar Guzman Ulloa, to speak at the Global Eco Asia-Pacific Tourism Conference in Townsville Australia November 26 – 28, 2018. We previously conducted sustainability activities as part of the BCC/CUNY Palma de Mallorca, Spain Study Abroad program (June 1 – 16, 2018). The activities included the installation of a weather station at a local high school in Mallorca, collecting climate, air pollution and UV radiation data using our CUNY designed backpack weather stations and the training of over 450 Mallorcan and American high school students studying abroad in sustainability and other STEM activities using a Collective Social Learning (CSL) workshop format. Over 10 million tourists visit Palma de Mallorca during the summer months and our group and the activities we conducted were highly received by the people and tourists on Mallorca and we created quite a stir on the island for the two weeks of our program. We are being invited to present on our Mallorca activities as a model for community sustainability engagement in popular tourist destinations in the Asia-Pacific-Oceania region so as to help monitor the environment and arrest the destruction of the environment through the activities of the local and tourist population.

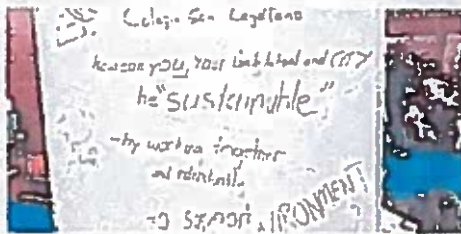


Photo: Palma de Mallorca, Spain Study Abroad Program (June 1- 16, 2018)
