RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE OPENING OF TWO (2) NEW MONEY MARKET ACCOUNTS IN THE NAMES OF BCC ASSOCIATION, INC. AND THE EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER.

WHEREAS, Bronx Community College Association, Inc. (BCC Inc.) is a separately incorporated, 501c3 Not-for-profit entity created "to concern itself with the welfare of students of Bronx Community College) and with the funding of student activities from Student Activities Fees.

WHEREAS, the Association does not operate for profit and no revenues of the corporation will inure to the benefit of any officer or director of the Association, but will be used solely to support and promote the purposes stated above.

WHEREAS, both the BCC Association, Inc. and ECC have cash balances in excess of \$1M. In the case of the Association, approximately \$800K is earning 0.1% interest annually, while the ECC is currently not earning interest on its cash balance.

WHEREAS, the current rate on Money Market accounts with Citibank is 1.4% or 14 times their CD rates.

BE IT RESOLVED, the BCC Association, Inc. hereby approves the opening of two (2) new Money Market accounts in the names of BCC Association Inc. and the Early Childhood Center to benefit from the higher available rates.
