<sup>2</sup>MTH 1/MTH 5 are no longer available. Students with Math Proficiency Index of 59 or lower may now enroll in corequisite courses MTH 21.5 or MTH 23.5. Students with 39 or lower MPI are strongly encouraged to enroll in Math Start/CUNY Start.

<sup>3</sup>Students may select either a 4-credit STEM variant science course or a 3-credit science course to fulfill Required Core C. Students selecting a 3-credit course must also complete an additional 1-credit lab course to fulfill graduation requirements.

These students will be exempted from a foreign language requirement at Bronx Community College.

<sup>9</sup>NYS Education Department requires teacher education candidates to complete a three credit course designed to meet the needs of all students in an inclusive classroom (EDU 30). After May 2014, teacher candidates will be required to take an examination-Educating All Students.

Students planning to transfer to Lehman College must achieve a 3.0 index in their Education coursework at BCC and a grade point average of 2.75 or better for admission into Lehman College's Early Childhood/Childhood Program.
