ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Graduates of the A.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences degree from Bronx Community College (BCC) will qualify for admission into the CUNY School of Professional Studies (CUNY SPS) Bachelor of Arts degree in Liberal Studies if they have maintained a minimum overall GPA of 2.5 and are in good academic standing at BCC. In addition, applicants must have a grade of C or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course. Applicants will follow the standard admissions process, which includes completing a transfer application.

BCC students must complete the CUNY Transfer Application and include a personal essay of at least 250 words. Students applying for the Fall semester are encouraged to complete the application by February 1, while students applying for the Spring semester are encouraged to complete the application by September 15.

BCC graduates will be awarded 60 transfer credits towards the bachelor's degree. Upon matriculation into the BA program in Liberal Studies, students will be required to fulfill electives and major requirements specified on the following pages.

OVERVIEW OF SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

The BA in Liberal Studies program represents CUNY's first online BA in the liberal arts and sciences. Unlike most majors, which emphasize the mastery of a single discipline, Liberal Studies affirms the intellectual and professional value of learning to think across conventional disciplinary lines. Liberal Studies majors take classes in a variety of subjects, including English, history, philosophy, music, math, and the social and natural sciences.

The broad curriculum of the BA in Liberal Studies makes the program particularly attractive to adult/nontraditional students as it offers an efficient pathway to degree completion.

BRONX COMMUNITY COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS and TRANSFER EQUIVALENCIES

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

- The Academic Director and Department Chair/Program Coordinator from both programs will review the agreement annually. They will be expected to review student retention, progress to graduation including transitions between prerequisite and next-level courses, degree completion, and GPA. Modification or termination of this agreement requires the approval of Chief Academic Officers of both institutions.
- Should the agreement be modified or terminated, the CUNY School of Professional Studies shall honor the terms granted to students who have already transferred into the B.A. in Liberal Studies for a period of four years or graduation, whichever comes first.
- The CUNY School of Professional Studies Registrar and the Liberal Studies Academic Director shall produce reports of the metrics identified above as well as those suggested in the University's Annual Performance Management Program, which will be circulated to the following groups:
 - At CUNY SPS: Dean, Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, Liberal Studies Consortial Faculty, Associate Dean for Administration and Finance, Associate Dean of Student and Community Affairs, Assistant Dean of Enrollment Management and Admissions.
 - At BCC: Chief Academic Officer, Associate Dean for Curriculum and Academic Programs, AA Liberal Arts and Sciences Program Coordinator, Director of Admissions, and Director of Online Learning.

The CUNY School of Professional Studies and Bronx Community College will publicize this opportunity for students in print and web-based materials and in marketing information. Additionally, both institutions will provide information to their own recruitment staff members as well as staff at the University Office of Admission Services.

Effective date - Fall 2022

Expiration date – Fall 2027, though agreement will be honored for an additional two years for students enrolled at BCC while agreement is active.
