Students must go to the CUNY.edu and complete a transfer application. Application Priority Deadlines are as follows: Spring Admissions: September 15 Fall Admissions: February 1

A personal essay of at least 250 words is part of the application process.

Transfer Credit Summary and Additional Credits to Complete

Bronx Community College graduates with the Associate Degree in <u>Liberal Arts and Sciences</u>, <u>Psychology Option</u> will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of <u>Arts in Psychology at CUNY School of Professional Studies</u>.
