B. REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Applicants must possess a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

Note: A minimum grade of C is required in all courses in the Psychology major. Where there are prerequisites, a student may not progress to the next course in the sequence without having a C in the prerequisite course(s).

Students must go to the CUNY.edu and complete a transfer application. Application Priority Deadlines are as follows:

Spring Admissions: September 15

Fall Admissions: February 1

A personal essay of at least 250 words is part of the application process.

Transfer Credit Summary and Additional Credits to Complete

Bronx Community College graduates with the Associate Degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences, Psychology Option will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at CUNY School of Professional Studies. In addition, they will be deemed to have met all lower level, Pathways general education requirements at CUNY School of Professional Studies.
