Minutes of April 26, 2023 (Loew Hall, 200)

- 1. **Call to Order:** At 2:06 P.M., meeting called to order by S. Powers.
- 2. **Approval of the March 22, 2023, minutes**: After a motion by N. Jampol, the minutes from 03/22/23 were approved unanimously by the 13 voting members present. *E. Mananga and S. Ali were not present for the vote*.
- 3. **Appeals report:** C. Byrd reported they are starting to pick up, as the SAP appeal period ends on May 1<sup>st</sup>. K. Ismail asked for clarification regarding the academic appeal process. A. Rivers asked a question about the WU and its impact on financial aid impact (it has no academic impact since Fall 2021). J. Heller asked regarding the W and whether the impact on financial liability changed with the change of deadline to withdraw with a W.
- 4. **Changes to the codification:** S. Powers reported that he'd presented the proposed changes in the codification due to changes in remediation and in the appeals section to the Senate on 3/23/23 with no questions asked. An email query after simply asked about the vote (which was unanimous).
- 5. **Nursing proposal:** S. Powers reported that he presented the proposal from Nursing to change the minimum grade for NUR 100/101 from a C+ to a C to the Senate on 3/23/23 with only one question clarifying which courses would be affected (only NUR 100/101).
- 6. Valedictorian/Salutatorian selection process: (see agenda) A. Ott, T. Fisher, and S. Powers began a discussion of the Valedictorian/Salutatorian selection process that will be addressed in the fall. Three primary queries have been raised: whether certificate students should be eligible for these honors, if summer graduates should be included in the prior year's graduation (the prior rather than the following June) or not at all, and how transferred courses as well as prior learning credits (e.g., AP) are factored into the calculations of the academic index determination. A. Ott also noted it's possible someone could turn down the honor or be unreachable and there is nothing in the policy to address that situation. Discussion ensued.
- 7. **May 10<sup>th</sup> meeting discussion:** S. Powers proposed that, as there is no actionable business left to attend this academic year, that the May 10<sup>th</sup> meeting be canceled. After a motion by S. Powers, the proposal was accepted unanimously by all 16 members present for the vote.

- 8. **Granting Registrar the right to graduate students:** S. Powers reminded members that the committee needs to grant the Registrar the right to graduate the classes of August 2022, January 2023, and June 2023. After a motion by S. Powers, the committee voted unanimously in favor of granting that right to the Registrar by all 16 members present.
- 9. **New Business:** C. Byrd asked, and S. Powers confirmed, that the same committee members as last summer would be reviewing summer appeals in 2023: S. Powers, N. Jampol, G. Cobb, P. Jaijairam, and T. Fisher.
- 10. **Adjournment**: S. Powers thanked members for their service. Members thanked T. Fisher for her service. After a motion from V. Rodriguez, the meeting adjourned at 2:53pm.

**Revision:** To modify the selection process used to determine the valedictorian and salutatorian by amending the objective criteria to address associate degree versus certificate program as well as explore questions regarding courses taken at prior colleges and prior learning.

## 11.7 Graduation Honors

### 11.7 Graduation Honors

- iv. Mid-term grades shall not be used to calculate the cumulative index for the purpose of selecting the valedictorian or salutatorian.
- v. In those cases where the foregoing procedures do not result in a clear difference among competing individuals, the commencement committee shall consider the following additional factors to distinguish the scholarship performance of candidates\*
