**BCC PRESIDENTIAL SEARCH:** Chancellor Félix V. Matos Rodríguez, has announced the official kick-off of the search for the next permanent President for Bronx Community College. RPA, Inc., the search firm assisting with the search and members from CUNY's Executive Search Office staff, will be meeting with key stakeholders for even more input and feedback in the next few weeks.

**ENROLLMENT:** Registration for summer classes and fall 2024 is open and ongoing. Please continue encouraging your students to register now. **A Bronco Reconnect Mixer** is scheduled for April 18, 2024, 10am-6pm; Colston Hall, Lower Level.

Several exciting new enrollment marketing initiatives are underway, including cable TV spots in both English and Spanish focusing on enrollment and highlighting programs that lead to well-paying jobs with a two-year degree. ASAP is featured with testimonials from a current student as well as an alum, and our fully online degree programs are featured for their appeal to the adult learner population.

**OFFICE OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS:** I am happy to report that CUNY has approved BCC's submission for the Transformation Fund Allocation submitted last month. The initiatives are one-time expenditures related to CUNY's use of "transformational funding," and funds must be used for initiatives that help support innovation, meet future workforce needs, enhance student support services, improve academic programs, increase enrollment, and modernize campus operations. The majority of the funding will be provided in FY'25, however, there are a few which will receive monies for FY'24. BCC submitted a total of eleven (11) proposals and all were accepted for a total allocation of \$695,013 The approved initiatives are the following:

- Development and implementation of a distance education certificate in nuclear medicine technology: total: \$37,653; FY'25.
- Revision of the existing Computer Information Systems AAS degree to develop and implement two new 12-credit degree options (Artificial Intelligence and Programming) alongside the development and implementation of two 36-credit certificates \$79,000 FY'24
- Preparing for Promotion Mentoring Program; total \$32,000 [PS \$25K, FY'25- OTPS \$7K; \$4K FY'24; \$3K FY'25]
- ➤ Brightspace Faculty Trainer program: total \$24,000 FY'24
- ➤ Ensure all academic programs--credit and non-credit--are preparing students for career pathways OTPS \$40,865 [11,500 FY '24/\$29,365 FY'25]
- ➤ Publication Mentoring Program: Total \$42,000 [\$3,000 FY'24/\$39,000 FY'25]

**BUSINESS OFFICE:** The University Budget Office has released a **draft** 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter financial report and is currently being reviewed for BCC's response. The budget office will begin distributing FY 2025 budget templates during the first week of May.

The Accounts Payable Office holds travel and expense training online every Wednesday at 1pm.until June 12th. Staff can register for the sessions on the BCC website via the IT training office.

The cafeteria RFP advertisement has been placed on the State and City websites. The finance and budget team is coordinating to facilitate the procurement of new equipment for the cafeteria. The team is working diligently to prepare all campus food service areas, including the removal of old equipment and a general uplift of the site including, cleaning, electrical and painting, for the site visit of prospective RFP vendor respondents scheduled on May 2, 2024. The Food Truck RFEI has not resulted in any proposals form interested vendors to date.

**CAMPUS PLANNING/CAMPUS OPERATIONS:** It is an exciting time around campus as we see progress on so many campus projects. Meister Hall *Bronx Express*, the long-awaited project to house Registrar, Admissions, Financial Aid and Bursar together in a one-stop locale has finally kicked off with site surveys by the contractors. The Meister Hall re-lighting project is scheduled to be completed during spring break. Ongoing projects include the Phase VI Boiler Upgrade Project; the New Hall Plaza/Terrace roof design which will replace the entire terrace, and provide an accessible ramp, parapet and railings; the Hall of Fame roof protection; and the fire alarm upgrades continue in 12-Buildings - CO, CM, LH, PH, BU, NI, LO, HL HA, GU, BL, GH: for review and coordinating with FDNY for inspections.
