## Bronx Community College PRESIDENT' S COMMUNITY REPORT – DECEMBER 2023 Milton Santiago, Ed.D.

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of the calendar year and already halfway through this academic year. The holiday season and year's end are natural markers for reflection and to assess what we are grateful for in our lives. It is also a time to think about new challenges ahead. I am asking all of the BCC community to continue to come together as one campus and build upon our work together to stay on the student centered, student focused theme I have emphasized all semester. I am grateful and appreciative to all of the faculty and staff who are supporting our students to the end goal of completing the fall semester and the academic year.

**GIVING TUESDAY:** On Tuesday, November 28<sup>th</sup>, BCC and all of CUNY celebrated Giving Tuesday. BCC concluded the day ranked #1 among Bronx schools, #2 among all Community Colleges and #9 among the 29 CUNY colleges. Thanks to the generosity and commitment of our faculty, staff, retirees, alumni and friends, our campaign raised over \$74,000 in support of the Help a Bronco Scholarship, the Kalief Browder Memorial Scholarship, the Amadou Diallo Memorial Scholarship, and the Food Pantry. **WINTER & SPRING REGISTRATION:** We are nearing the end of the ninth week of registration for the Winter/Spring 2024 semester. We currently have 3,616 students registered, which is higher than this time last year. Our FTEs are 2,618 which is also higher than this time last year. We are ahead in our continuing and readmit students maintaining the progress of last semester. Continuing students remain our focus for academic advisors to advise/register as many students as possible before the end of the year. There are 657 students registered for the Winter Session which is also higher than last year at this time.

**ENROLLLMENT:** There is a 400% increase in new student applications and the Central Office has awarded BCC \$40,000 in campus funds to respond to the increase. These funds will be used specifically for relevant admissions staff to review Spring 2024 applications and communicate promptly a student's admission. Additional funds will be awarded for the Fall. The proposed allocation is intended for use from December 1, 2024, to February 15, 2024. This time frame is chosen to ensure students who applied in September and October, receive a prompt response. Members of the enrollment management team are happy to report their participation in the IN-Tech Academy's Inaugural College & Career March. In addition, in collaboration with the DOE, MOUs have been finalized with four NYC high schools to offer dual enrollment opportunities and support for students in grades 9-12. This effort should provide additional enrollment opportunities and increased FTEs. Thanks to all those who made this initiative possible.

**CAPITAL PROJECTS:** I am happy to report that BCC has received nearly \$25 million in capital funding for the design and construction service to upgrade the campus building management system (BMS). The BMS upgrade will provide a reliable control system to support the campus boiler, chiller and HVAC systems. The changes will also yield energy savings along with a reduction in greenhouse gasses. The project is anticipated to be completed by Dec. 2026.

**(MSCHE) SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION RESPONSE:** As I have been communicating, BCC's accrediting authority has asked for a Supplemental Information Response in light of our low graduation rates. The response was filed by the deadline on Wed. December 13<sup>th</sup>. Please review the report <u>HERE</u>.

**GRANTS AND PARTNERSHIPS:** BCCF was awarded \$25,000 from the Bronx Community Foundation to support CUNY Start at BCC. CUNY Start is an intensive and affordable semester-long program designed for Bronx Community College students who need to boost their Math and English skills before taking credited courses. The PI is Pamela Skinner.

NYC School Bus Umbrella Services (NYCSBUS) and their project partners have been awarded the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority's (NYSERDA) Clean Transportation Prize through the Electric Truck and Bus Challenge. The winning project, "Electrifying School Buses in the Bronx and Beyond (ESB<sup>3</sup>)," for which BCC won \$1.6 in funding, provides a framework to accelerate the deployment of zero-emission school buses in New York City and throughout the State. The PI is Clement Drummond.
