BRONX COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO COLLEGE SENATE – NOVEMBER 2023 MILTON SANTIAGO, ED.D.

The Fall 2023 Semester has flown by. As the holiday season approaches, I want to emphasize how grateful I am for the hard work and dedication shown to our students by the campus community. I have honed my student-centered/student-focused approach to service that our students deserve, and I hope you will continue to reinforce it through the end of the semester. I trust you will continue to strengthen our commitment to delivering exceptional service to students throughout the remainder of the semester. I would like to take this opportunity to give thanks to all the faculty, staff and students of Bronx Community College. Your dedication and commitment to learning and service all leads to providing our students with the quality education they need and deserve.

SPRING 2024 ENROLLMENT: A reminder that we are beginning the fifth week of student registration for the Winter/Spring 2024 semester. Please encourage all your students to register for spring classes. Currently, 1,956 students are registered. This represents an 8% uptick from this time last year. There are 426 students registered for the Winter Session.

Focusing on the continuing student population is the priority for academic advisors with the goal of advising/registering as many students as possible before the in-person registration period begins on Tuesday, November 28th. Enhanced focus and efforts to meet the new full-time enrollment and overall enrollment targets include – additional funding identified for marketing and recruitment efforts, along with bi-weekly emails to students with registration information.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS: The college received a communication from The Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE), based on the Commission's regular review and analysis of data it is charged to collect. For 2023, in the category of Student Achievement and Annual Enrollment- FTE, the Commission has found cause for concern in BCC's graduation rates, which are below 23%. As a result, BCC has been asked to file a supplemental information report (SIR) providing graduation rates for the last two years (Standard IV) and a narrative analysis and plan for addressing the concerns, (Standard IV). I will be working with all stakeholders to address this issue and plan for the college's response, which is due by December 13, 2023. More discussion will be taking place across the governance bodies of the college. I look forward to hearing from constituent groups on how we can collectively work together to improve our retention and graduation rates.

Congratulations to Tica Frazer for receiving an award of \$175,000 from the College Completion Innovation Fund (CCIF) for the project titled "Junior Advisor Intervention Model." CCIF received a significant number of proposals from a variety of community-based organizations and colleges engaged in impressive work, and this project has been selected for the CCIF's 2023 Award Cycle. Over the next year this project aims to substantially increase college persistence rates for the students that we serve. The award covers the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2025.

BCC is launching a new degree program, the <u>AS in Health Sciences</u>, in Spring 2024. This degree creates an academic home for the many students interested in the health professions. The program exposes students to a variety of health careers while at the same time providing them with industry-aligned, "stackable" certification and experiential learning opportunities. The AS in Health Sciences was developed through a multi-departmental effort led by <u>Dr. Stacia Reader</u> of the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department. Our thanks to Dr. Reader and all those who collaborated in developing and launching this new degree program.

BCC competed in this competitive challenge with other private and public colleges in the Bronx. As the winner of the challenge, BCC will receive a \$1 million award, funded by the New York Power Authority, to develop and implement a plan to both improve campus sustainability and reduce the College's environmental footprint.

This is a big win for BCC, and it would not have been possible without the efforts of Neal Phillip, Paramita Sen, Olaitan Femi-Falade, and Emily Marino, who were instrumental in shaping a winning vision for a more sustainable campus. Special thanks as well to Octavio Gomez and David Taylor, who showed us how our facilities could rise to the Green Action Challenge.
