Students with ESL need should take appropriate ESL course/s (Sequence: ESL 01 > 02 > 03 > 09) before enrolling in ENG 110.

² Students with Math Proficiency Index (MPI) of 0-59 enroll in corequisite course MTH 23.5 OR MTH 28.5. Students with MPI of 39 or lower are strongly encouraged to enroll in Math Start/CUNY Start. Students in this curriculum with Nursing intent are strongly advised to take MTH 23 OR 23.5 to fulfill Required Core B. Students interested in Radiologic Technology, Nuclear Medicine Technology, and Medical Laboratory Technician should take MTH 28 OR 28.5.
