B. REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Applicants must possess a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

Note: A minimum grade of C is required in all courses in the Psychology major. Where there are prerequisites, a student may not progress to the next course in the sequence without having a C in the prerequisite course(s).

This agreement also serves as a commitment from BCC to partner in good faith with SPS as part of the Online Psychology Academy. As part of the Online Psychology Academy, no transfer application will be needed. Students will instead respond to outreach from the CUNY SPS Admissions Office indicating their intent to attend SPS the following semester.

Transfer Credit Summary and Additional Credits to Complete

Bronx Community College graduates with the Associate Degree in <u>Liberal Arts and Sciences</u>, <u>Psychology Option</u> will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of <u>Arts</u> in <u>Psychology</u> at <u>CUNY School of Professional Studies</u>. In addition, they will be deemed to have met all lower level, Pathways general education requirements at <u>CUNY</u> <u>School of Professional Studies</u>. Upon matriculation into the B.A. Psychology Program, students will be required to fulfill electives and major requirements specified on the following pages.
