INTERESTING AND UNIQUE MAJORS

I often convey to students that passion for a major translates into higher-quality work. However, sometimes finding the right major can be a challenge, especially if you are not aware of its existence.

Years ago, a student connected with me because she was looking to transfer to a major that complemented

her position at the Bronx Zoo working with children. She was pursuing the AA in Liberal Arts and wanted to be able to discuss the animals with greater authority but was not necessarily interested in a STEM major. I suggested that she explore the CUNY Baccalaureate for Unique and Interdisciplinary Studies. Also known as the CUNY BA program, it gives students the responsibility for the content of their degree. I assisted that student with a proposal for a major in Animal Behavior where she was able to take a wide range of courses at different CUNY schools that included science communication, animal cognition, and research methods in psychology. On the CUNY BA program website, you can see other proposed majors

such as Art and Social Change, Digital Game Narrative, and Storytelling and Community Justice. Similarly, SUNY Empire State University (SUNY ESU) also gives students the flexibility to design their own degree programs. The possibilities are remarkable. And while these two institutions offer incredible prospects, there are other interesting majors across CUNY to explore.

The CUNY School of Professional Studies (CUNY SPS) offer several unique online majors related to human services and social sciences. The B.A. in Disability Studies is the first undergraduate degree of its kind that explores disability through overlapping perspectives that includes the social sciences, human sciences.

manities, science, and law. The program "provides graduates with the skills to improve the lives of people with disabilities and with an educational credential to advance their careers." CUNY SPS also offers a B.A. in Human Relations that prepares students to understand and respond to the various challenges of human behavior and relationships in an evolving and

technologically oriented workplace. As noted in their catalog, the major draws "on the fields of psychology, sociology, business, communications, and the humanities, students examine the organizational forms, practices, and policies that can foster or hinder the development of productive relationships and organizational success." The B.A. in Youth Studies provides the tangible skill development needed to work with young people under the age of 24 while "infusing an approach rooted in critical youth studies and a commitment to a social justice orientation."



PASSION FOR A MAJOR TRANSLATES INTO HIGHER-QUALITY WORK

CUNY SPS also offers unique online majors for **registered nurses** that concurrently provide a smooth pro-

gression to master's programs. The R.N. to B.S.-M.S. in Nursing Organizational Leadership prepares nurses to be able to contribute to the health, education, and social structure of communities by assuming positions of leadership. The R.N. to B.S.-M.S. in Nursing Education prepares nurses to develop curricula and graduates are qualified to serve as educators in community colleges and universities, as well as in academic health centers and community-based health facilities. The R.N. to B.S.-M.S. in Nursing Informatics guides nursing professionals to assess institutional data needs, manage data effectively, and improve patient care quality. Informatics nurses use, integrate,

and analyze technology to make changes in nursing practice, advance health outcomes, and facilitate research and education. Nursing informatics is a specialty that transforms data into needed information and leverages technologies to improve health and health care equity, safety, quality, and outcomes

According to the McWilliams School of Biomedical Informatics at UTHealth Houston, Biomedical Informatics studies the acquisition, communication, processing, integration, analysis, retrieval, interpretation, and presentation of data and determines how to transform data to actionable knowledge with the aim of solving problems in disease prevention and healthcare delivery. New York City College of Technology (City Tech) offers a B.S. in Biomedical Informatics that Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science and Mathematics students can transfer into: "The program offers two interrelated component areas of Biomedical Informatics: Molecular Bioinformatics, centered on the use of conformational and genomic data to elucidate biological phenomena; and Health Informatics, focused on the secure electronic storage, retrieval, and use of biomedical information in healthcare delivery and research." Computer Science and Mathematics students may also consider City Tech's B.S. in Data Science which the U.S. Census Bureau defines as "a field of study that uses scientific methods, processes, and systems to extract knowledge and insights from data." City Tech also offers a B.S. in Data Analytics which is primarily focused on answering questions based on analysis of existing datasets.

Business majors can consider City Tech's B.S. in Business and Technology of Fashion, that offers modules in Global Fashion, Innovation in E-Commerce, and

Fashion Merchandising Administration. English majors can consider the B.S. in Professional and Technical Writing where students learn to create content that connects technical expertise with the needs of different audiences by mastering writing, editing, and design skills using industry-standard digital tools and practices. The B.S.Ed. in Career and Technical Education equips students with teaching experience through internships and student teaching. The program has trained many well-prepared teachers and administrators in career and technical education areas such as electronics, computer technology, and graphic arts.

What I have noted here is a sample of what can be found throughout CUNY. There are also unique and interesting majors at SUNY and private schools. Connect with Transfer Services to learn more about them or if you want advisement for any of the majors detailed here.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS & OTHER PARTNERSHIPS

An **articulation agreement** is an agreement between two schools that helps course credit at one school to be accepted or transferred and applied toward a degree at another school.

A **joint degree program** agreement stipulates that following successful completion of the associate degree program and graduation from Bronx Community College, students will be automatically accepted into the specified baccalaureate program of the named senior college.

A **memorandum of understanding** (**MOU**) is an agreement between institutions that expresses an agreed course of action and conditions under which the receiving institution will accept students for matriculation.

BCC-BARUCH BUSINESS ACADEMY

The Baruch Business Academy is a transfer support program that helps students move smoothly from BCC to Baruch College's Zicklin School of Business, one of the top business schools in New York City. Academy students complete the Business Administration Associate degree at BCC and transfer to Baruch to complete their Bachelor's degree in any of Baruch's business majors. Academy students receive personalized support, guidance, and mentorship every step of the way through a clear, structured transfer pathway designed to help them succeed at BCC, at Baruch, and in future business careers.

Why join the Baruch Business Academy?

- A clear path through BCC and Baruch: Know exactly which courses to complete at BCC to stay on track for transfer to Baruch
- Dedicated support: Access support from both BCC and Baruch on your transfer planning and business career preparation
- Community: Join the Academy's networking events, community meet-ups, and career preparation workshops to connect with other Baruch-bound students and prepare for Baruch and beyond

Transfer Services provides students with services to inform and facilitate transfer to appropriate senior colleges.

Transfer Services can help you:

- Understand the educational paths that will move you toward your intended career
- Ensure that your degree program is consistent with your objectives
- Select courses to maximize the number of credits transferred
- Take charge of your planning for transfer by teaching you how to conduct research
- Understand the benefit of articulation agreements

Transfer Services addresses student needs via advisement, coordination of the transfer fair, the *Transfer Talk* newsletter, videos, and workshops.

TRANSFER PLANNING: WHAT TO DO AND WHEN TO DO IT

The primary reason for early and continuous transfer planning is to ensure that the desired degree program and curriculum are consistent with future career or educational plans. Waiting until the last semester may limit options. Articulation agreements and other partnerships are excellent tools for transfer planning because they provide a course of action for students, including an outline of the most appropriate courses to schedule.

0-12 Credits

- Read the College Catalog (students are responsible for knowing what their degree entails).
- Explore Pathways course options. (Pathways is CUNY's general education)
- Visit Career Development to explore career options and their requirements.
- Read articulation agreements.
- Become familiar with DegreeWorks, CUNYfirst, and Transfer Explorer.
- Attend a Transfer Planning workshop.
- Select your degree program.

13-24 Credits

- Attend the Transfer Fair.
- Check for new articulation agreements.
- · Visit college websites.
- Check your progress on DegreeWorks.
- Visit Career Development and write your resume.

25-35 Credits

- Attend the Transfer Fair.
- Attend a Scholarship Workshop.
- Explore transfer options.
- Attend senior college open house events.
- Begin scholarship search.
- Check your progress on DegreeWorks.
- · Check for new articulation agreements.

36-45 Credits

- Check your progress on DegreeWorks.
- Update your resume.
- Attend the Transfer Fair.
- · Apply for scholarships.
- Check for new articulation agreements.

Final Semester

- Apply for graduation.
- Send applications.
- Apply for financial aid and scholarships.
- Attend orientation at your new school.

- Students transferring to a CUNY four-year college should check if there are specific grade requirements for courses as well as for the program of choice.
- Students applying to a CUNY fouryear college should also note that if more than one college was attended, the GPA for admissions will be determined through a combination calculation of all attempted coursework.
